



Crime and conflict

This topic, students learn about the cause, effects and solutions to crime and conflict on a local, national and global scale

Where are why do crimes happen?

How do the consequences of crimes vary?

How can crimes be prevented?

What are the causes and effects of different organised crimes? (9-mark assessment question)

Where is there conflict?

Why are conflicts happening?

What are the causes and effects of different conflicts?

How can conflicts be prevented? (End of unit test)



Assessment:

1. Extended writing on organised, international crime (9-mark question).
2. Test to contain skills, multiple choice knowledge questions, short written answers and longer questions answers with SPAG marks



Suggested enrichment activities:

- Watch/read the news
- Visit police.uk and look at the crimes in your area. You could compare to different places
- Investigate a real life crime online. Think about impacts and how it could be prevented
- In your local high street look out for the target hardening strategies in place and evaluate how effective these are
- Visit the Imperial War Museum in London
